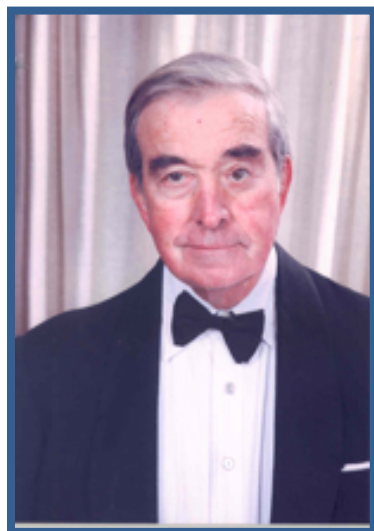
### *D. Craig Brater, M.D.*



D. Craig Brater, M.D., FACP was the President of the USP Convention and a member of the USP Board of Trustees from 2000 to 2005 and has been serving on the Board as Past President for the last five years. During his presidency, he chaired the 2005 Nominating Committee for the Council of Experts. Prior to being elected president, Dr. Brater was the Convention delegate for the Indiana University School of Medicine (1990 to 1995) and the American College of Physicians (1995 to 2000). Dr. Brater is dean (2000 to present) and Walter J. Daly professor at the Indiana University School of Medicine. Dr. Brater is a staunch supporter of USP's globalization efforts and is recognized for his tireless efforts to bring USP quality standards to people worldwide.

Edwin D. Bransome, Jr., M.D., F.A.C.E., has dedicated more than 30 years to USP. He culminated his service by leading the USP Convention as its President (1998 to 2000) and as a member of the Board of Trustees (1990 to 2000), as Past-President (2000 to 2005), and as a member of the Constitution and Bylaws Committee (1995 and 2005). As a Board member, he also served on the Executive (1999 to 2000), Investment (2000 to 2005), Patient Safety (2003 to 2005), and Health Care Information (2003 to 2004) Committees of the Board of Trustees. In addition, Dr. Bransome chaired the Real Estate Committee (2001 to 2005) and the Task Force on Certification of Suitability (2004 to 2005) of the Board of Trustees. He began his service on the Committee of Revision, precursor to the Council of Experts (1976 to 1990), and the Executive Committee of Revision (1976 to 1981). He was a member of two Subcommittees of the Committee of Revision – the Scope Subcommittee (1976 to 1980) and the Biochemistry and Microbiology Subcommittee (1980 to 1990) – and chaired the Therapeutics I Subcommittee (1980 to 1985). He also chaired the Advisory Panel on Endocrinology (1976 to 1985) and continued as a member of the panel (1985 to 1990). He was a member of the Committee on Governance (1992 to 1995) and the Ad Hoc Committee on the Structure and Process of the Committee of Revision (1995 to 1998), and he chaired the Committee on Implementation and Transition (1997 to 1998). He also represented the Medical Association of Georgia in the USP Convention (1985 to 2000). Dr. Bransome is a Consultant in Endocrinology, Diabetes, and Metabolism as well as Professor Emeritus in the Medicine and Physiology departments at the Medical College of Georgia, where he has been a member of the faculty since 1970.

He also was a member of the 2005 Resolution 7 Advisory Body in the 2005 to 2010 cycle. Dr. Cranston also was the vice-chair of the National Coordinating Council for Medication Reporting and Prevention (2004 to 2005) and was part of the Coalition Working Group that developed Principles of a Sound Drug Formulary System (2000), both of which were USP supported activities.
