### Use of "USP" Designation

Permission is not required to use the non-stylyzed letters "USP" in conjunction with a named product (drug substance, dietary supplement, etc.) if there is a USP monograph for that product and the product conforms to the USP monograph. For example, the term "USP aspirin" may be used to promote aspirin that conforms to the USP aspirin monograph. More details are available at ¶3.20 General Notices of *USP-NF*.
